
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Update on COVID-19

- City Council held a very brief, remote meeting on Thursday to introduce legislation that lays out a framework for us to hold public meetings remotely. Check out the legislation in <u>this link</u> and send any feedback to <u>our clerk.</u>

Chamber RVA COVID-19 Resources

Richmond Economic Development Authority Small Business Disaster Loan

The Richmond Economic Development Authority announced yesterday the Richmond Small Business Disaster Loan Program (COVID-19), which will offer interest-free emergency loans of up to \$20,000 to small businesses within city limits.

The program is intended to provide relief to small businesses who have been affected by the COVID-19 pandemic. Monies will go toward paying employee wages, empowering local, small businesses to continue operating and keep employees on their payroll.

The maximum loan amount for the program is six months of current employee wages or \$20,000, whichever is less. Loan payments will be disbursed over six months. Businesses with 25 employees or less may apply.

Repayment of the loans will be deferred for six months, followed by 48 months of no-interest payments.

Small businesses interested in applying should fill out the application and provide the required documentation via email. The application will be available starting Monday, April 6, on the city's <u>COVID-19 webpage</u>. Funding is limited. Applications will be considered in the order they are submitted.

Happy Census Week!

Did you receive a mailer about responding to the census online? I received mine last week and completed it yesterday. It took 6 minutes to complete the information for myself, my son and daughter. Find those 6 minutes today and complete it!

Here are a few reminders about the census:

-All residents need to be counted and one's citizenship status does not matter.

-Everyone in a household needs to be counted, including children.

-One uncounted person can lose the City \$20,000 in Federal funding over the ten years until the next Census.

-It's easier than ever to complete the Census online, over the phone, or by mail, and only takes a few minutes.

-The Census is completely confidential and secure. The personal information you provide is only used in order to count the population.

-The Census questionnaire is available in 12 languages other than English, both online and over the phone.

-Filling out the Census is a fun activity to do with the family while everyone's home – teach your kids about the importance of making everyone count.
